ST. PAUL PHYSICIAN REELECTED TO AMA DELEGATION

MINNEAPOLIS—The Minnesota Medical Association has reelected Kenneth W. Crabb, M.D. to serve a two-year term as delegate to the American Medical Association House of Delegates. The MMA is a professional organization representing about 10,000 physicians, fellows, residents, and medical students in Minnesota. The election was held September 15 in Minneapolis during the MMA's 153rd Annual Meeting.

Kenneth W. Crabb, M.D., who specializes in obstetrics and gynecology at Advanced Specialty Care for Women, PA, has practiced medicine in St. Paul since 1979. He is an adjunct professor in the OB/Gyn Department at the University of Minnesota, a physician reviewer/advisor for Stratis Health and a member of the American Society of Reproductive Medicine and the American Society for Colposcopy and Cervical Pathology. He is a past president of Ramsey Medical Society.
