### **ST. PAUL PHYSICIAN REELECTED TO AMA DELEGATION**

**MINNEAPOLIS** —The Minnesota Medical Association has reelected Frank J. Indihar, M.D., to serve a two-year term as a delegate to the American Medical Association House of Delegates. The MMA is a professional organization representing about 10,000 physicians, fellows, residents, and medical students in Minnesota. The election was held September 15 in Minneapolis during the MMA's 153rd Annual Meeting.

Dr. Indihar who specializes in internal medicine is vice president of HealthEast Care System, Inc. and the CEO/medical director of Bethesda Rehabilitation Hospitals of St. Paul and Minneapolis. He is also a consultant to the Social Security Administration's Office of Hearings and Appeals and an adjunct professor at the University of Minnesota Medical School. Dr. Indihar received the Distinguished Service Award, the MMA's highest honor, during the meeting.

AMA delegates attend meetings of the AMA House of Delegates, participate in the development of AMA policies on health care issues, and at the state level, take part in policy development through the work of the MMA Board of Trustees.

First elected as an alternate delegate to the AMA in 1992 and a delegate in 1996, Dr. Indihar currently serves as chair of the Minnesota delegation to the AMA.
